<u>New Release</u> 3NV Bookwalter Notebook Red Wine



It has been very easy to be an advocate for the red wines of Washington State. Year in and year out they deliver the goods, both in quality and in value. This weeks wine, the non-vintage Bookwalter Notebook Red Wine is no exception. What makes this wine a bit different from other Washington State reds is the vinification method. It is done in a Solera style which is the process of fractional blending in such a way that the finished wine is a mixture of ages with the average age gradually increasing as the process continues over many years. If I break it down in black and white, the Notebook Red is a blend of both the 2010 and 2011 vintages. The final blend of varietals is 73% Syrah, 17% Cabernet Sauvignon, 6% Merlot, 2% Malbec and 2% Cabernet Franc. Vineyards from the Columbia Valley, Horse Heaven Hill, Red Mountain and Yakima Valley appellations make up this wine. This wine has an extraordinary flavor profile and complexity for a \$10 bottle of wine. We have been selling this wine over the past few months and I finally decided to take a bottle home and try it myself. Now its your turn.

The Bookwalter 3NV Notebook Red, regularly \$14.99, is \$9.99 a bottle or \$100 per case.
